Clerk gave an update on the past due utilities report.

Richard Frankforter with Maguire Iron was in attendance and reported on the Water Tower Inspection report from October, 2015. Frankforter will provide an updated list and quote of priority repairs for the May 2016 regular meeting.

Clerk reported that a small change was made to the budget, due to an amount placed on an incorrect line. This change resulted in a \$.01 decrease in property taxes for the upcoming year. Changes have already been made at the county and state level.

Spooner made a motion to approve the mowing and trimming bid of \$35.00 per park for the 2 city parks to Deb Essick and \$39 per hour for the ball diamond to Regan Sylvester (Sylvester Farms). Fritz seconded the motion. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

Meyer made a motion to reject all bids presented for the sale of the plow truck and moved to take it to the Pocahontas Machinery Auction for the April 13 auction, with a minimum bid set. Fritz seconded the motion. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

First Reading of Ordinance 01-2016 ***AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WEBB, IOWA, 2013 BY DELETING SECTION 9.03 FROM TITLE IV, CHAPTER 1, ARTICLE 9 LOAD AND WEIGHT REQUIREMENTS AND REPLACING IN LIEU THEREOF A NEW SECTION 9.03 LOAD LIMITS UPON CERTAIN STREETS, AND ADDING A NEW SECTION 9.04 TRUCK ROUTES TO TITLE IV, CHAPTER 1, ARTICLE 9 LOAD AND WEIGHT REQUIREMENTS*** WHEREAS, the City of Webb needs to regulate weight limits upon City streets to protect City streets from damage; and Whereas, the City has determined Title IV, Article 9 Load and Weight Requirements is the appropriate place to establish regulations pertaining to weight limits and truck routes on City Streets; and BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of Webb, Iowa: Section 1. Title IV, Chapter 1 Traffic Code, Article 9 Load and Weight Requirements is amended by deleting Section 9.03 and replacing in lieu thereof a new Section 9.03 to now read as follows: 9.03 LOAD LIMITS UPON CERTAIN STREETS. When signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall operate any vehicle with a gross weight in excess of the amounts specified on such signs at any time upon any of the streets or parts of streets for which said signs are erected in accordance with Title IV, Chapter 1, Article 8 Traffic Control Devices of code. (Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.473 & 475) Section 2. A new Title IV, Chapter 1 Traffic Code, Article 9 Load and Weight Requirements, Section 9.04 is created to read as follows: 9.04 TRUCK ROUTE. When truck routes have been designated in accordance with Title IV, Chapter 1, Article 8 Traffic Control Devices of this code, any motor vehicle exceeding established weight limits shall comply with the following: 1. Use of Established Routes. Every such motor vehicle having no fixed terminal within the City or making no scheduled or definite stops within the City for the purpose of loading or unloading shall travel over or upon those streets within the City designated as truck routes and none other. (Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.473) 1. Deliveries Off Truck Route. Any such motor vehicle, when loaded or empty, having a fixed terminal, making a scheduled or definite stop within the City for the purpose of loading or unloading shall proceed over or upon the designated routes to the nearest point of its scheduled or definite stop and shall proceed thereto, load or unload and return, by the most direct route to its point of departure from said designated route. (Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.473) 1. Employer's Responsibility. The owner, or any other person, employing or otherwise directing the driver of any vehicle shall not require or knowingly permit the operation of such vehicle upon a street in any manner contrary to this section. (Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.473) Section 3.

Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed. Section 4. Severability Clause. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional. Section 5. When Effective. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law. Motion was made by Meyer to approve the first reading of Ordinance 01-2016. Fritz seconded the motion. Roll Call vote: Meyer-Aye, Greene-Aye, Fritz-Aye, Spooner, Hansen-Aye. Motion carried. Due to the rule of Super Majority passage, the council waives the second and third readings of this ordinance.

Motion to adjourn was made by Meyer and seconded by Greene.
